K-12 Attendance Policy

Elementary attendance will be monitored from 8:10 until 3:10. Students are expected to attend school daily and arrive on time.

- Students will be counted tardy AM if they arrive between 8:10 and 8:45
- Students will be counted tardy PM if they leave between 2:15 and 3:10
- At the elementary school level, **10 tardies will be counted as 1 unexcused absence.** Excessive tardies will be combined with other unexcused absences for truancy purposes.
- If a student arrives late or leaves early for up to 3 hours, or is gone for 3 hours during the day for an appointment, it will be counted as a ½ day excused absence.

Reporting and Recording Absences

- Parents or legal guardians are expected to call the building's attendance line, 913-993-4988, to report daily absences, late arrivals, or early dismissals. If a call is not received, school personnel will attempt to contact the parent. If no contact is made, the absence will be counted as unexcused.
- Absences by parent request for family and personal reasons are acceptable provided arrangements are made through the building principal in advance of the absence. These absences will count towards total absences. Students are responsible to complete all make-up work.
- When a student has reached **7 absences** during the school year, the parents will be sent a reminder letter. After **10 absences**, documentation will be required for all future absences. It is required for each subsequent absence/tardy for illness and appointments the student bring a doctor's note documenting the reason for the absence.

 An unexcused absence is one that has been classified as such by the building administration. An absence will be classified as unexcused if the parent or legal guardian does not follow the building attendance procedure.

On-Site Day Care




Visitor Information

Visitors can only enter the building through the main front doors.

Please have your driver's license ready to scan for your visitor sticker. Safety and security are important to all students and staff at Rushton.

At the end of your visit you must return to the office and check out with office personnel.



Illness

If a student has a significant injury or illness at school, the nurse will notify parents.

Children will be sent home from school if they have the following symptoms:

- Temperature of 100° with symptoms of illness.
- Severe colds, sneezing and cough (non-allergic).
- Red or discharging eyes (non-allergic).
- Upset stomach, vomiting and/or diarrhea.
- Undiagnosed rash, skin lesions, or suspicion of contagion.

<u>Students should be symptom-free for twenty-four hours without</u> <u>Tylenol or other medication before returning to school.</u>

Students who have a cast, sutures, or an incapacitating injury should bring a doctor's note detailing any limitations in school activities. When the cast or sutures are removed, a note from the doctor is necessary to resume full activity in P.E.

Absences

Twenty-four hours a day

Keep a student home if they complain about:

- Severe sore throat/headache
- Vomiting

 Temperature 100° or higher. Must be normal 98.6° without taking medication for twenty-four hours before they return to school Report absences due to contagious disease.

Report changes in home, work, or emergency numbers.



A registered nurse staffs the health room. The responsibilities of the nurse include screening vision, hearing, maintaining health records, providing first aid, assessing illnesses, notifying parents of communicable diseases, monitoring daily attendance, administering medication as ordered by physicians or dentist, and planning with staff to provide a safe environment for students.

Dress Code

We want the atmosphere of Rushton to promote a positive view of every student. Student's clothing should contribute to this idea. All students clothing is expected to be:

- Neat and clean
- Not promoting alcohol, tobacco or inappropriate language
- Pants must ride on the waist with no underwear showing.
- Shorts and dresses length should be even to or below fists when arms are at your side.
- **Midriffs must be covered at all times**. Tops and dresses with spaghetti straps need an additional top over or under.

If clothing violates these guidelines or a student's appearance becomes disruptive to others, the principal or teacher will ask the student to make necessary changes. A parent will be contacted if a student's appearance is a problem.

Drop Off and Dismissal Procedures

- In the morning:
- All car riders will be dropped on the west playground
- Walkers & bus riders will use Door #1.

In the afternoon:

- BUSSES ONLY will pick up in the front circle drive.
- All car riders in grades K-6 are to be picked up at west car parking lot. One continuous lane will move through the parking lot with several staff helping to load students.
- Car riders **will not** be dismissed to the front circle drive.
- All walkers will be dismissed at 3:10 to the front of the school.

Social Work Services

School social work services are available in all Shawnee Mission School District elementary schools. School social workers provide an array of services including class-based instruction. A child may also be referred for social work services by his/her parent(s)/guardian(s), principal, classroom teacher, or any other school staff. The social worker assigned to your child's school is licensed to practice social work in the State of Kansas. The elementary social worker is responsible for the following services:

^[2] Providing short-term individual and group counseling and support to students. This may include instruction for an entire classroom in which generic issues of social development are addressed (e.g. bullying, conflict resolution etc.) It may also include more structured individual or small group counseling that focuses on specific concerns of the participant(s) (e.g. friendship skills, anger, divorce etc.)

² Providing support to classroom teachers. This may include assistance with the development of a behavior plan.

Responding to crisis situations.

Implementing appropriate programs, groups and initiatives to target at-risk populations.

 $\ensuremath{\mathbbm Z}$ Coordinating and facilitating appropriate community services to students and their families.

Participation in structured short-term individual or group counseling shall only be by written parent/guardian consent.

Lunch

Students may either purchase lunch at school or bring their lunch.

- Student lunch \$ 2.85
 Student breakfast \$ 1.55
- Adult lunch \$ 3.95
- Adult breakfast \$ 2.35

Checks to pay for lunch should be made out to Rushton School and sent in an envelope with your child's name and the teacher's name on the envelope.

Negative balances will be sent to collections twice a year.

Parents will receive an automated call to their home phone when the student's lunch account is \$6.00 or less.

Please make sure the school always has the latest phone number for your family.



Students have the choice of 6 entrees daily.

You may either order a school lunch or bring your own.

If you would like your child to have a special lunch, please plan on eating at our family table outside the office. Only family may sit at these tables. No friends are allowed to join.

To be fair to other students we ask that you not bring fast food into the school cafeteria.

All students are expected to participate in recess.

Please check the daily weather report to make sure that your child is appropriately dressed for recess.

Classes will not have outdoor recess if:

- The temperature is below 15°
- The wind chill is below 0°
- Significant precipitation is falling

However teachers may take students out for quick "fresh air" breaks on these days.

Generally students well enough to be in school are well enough to be included in outdoor activities. If a student should remain inside at recess periods for a temporary health reason, a doctor's note explaining the condition and the request is required.

Telephone Usage by Students

School telephones may be used by students with the approval of a teacher or the office staff, but we request that they not be used to make after school social arrangements. Students are discouraged from calling home to ask parents to bring them materials they have forgotten. Students are encouraged to learn the responsibility of

POSSESSION AND USE OF CELL PHONES OR OTHER ELECTRONIC DEVICES

All cell phones should be turned off and kept in backpacks.

Board Policy JICJ

Students may possess a cell phone or any other electronic device while on school property or while attending a school-sponsored activity, but are prohibited from using electronic devices during the school day as defined by the building administration. Violations of this policy will be handled by appropriate school personnel and may include losing the privilege of bringing a cell phone or other electronic device to school.

The school district will not be responsible for lost, damaged, or stolen electronic devices. 12

Birthdays

Beginning with the 2019 – 2020 school year, birthday treats will no longer be allowed at Rushton.

Gifts, flowers, balloons, and other assorted items should not be brought to school for the students. **Those items cannot be taken to the classroom**. Those items will be left in the office until the end of the day.

Birthday invitations cannot be distributed in the classroom.

Animals in the Classroom

Consult your teacher and the school nurse before bringing animals to the classroom.

- 1. Dogs and cats must have a *rabies certificate.*
- 2. Vaccination certificate must be taken to the nurse before the animal visits the classroom.
- 3. Animals must be on a leash.
- 4. Birds and other animals (not dogs or cats) must be in a cage.
- 5. The parent must accompany the animal to the classroom.
- 6. All animals must be taken home after showing. They may not spend the day in the classroom.

Please be sensitive to the children who may be afraid of animals or birds.



Bicycles, Skateboards, and Roller Blades

- Students in grades 3-6 can ride bicycles to school with parental permission.
- Make sure students always walk their bikes at crosswalks and on school property.
- Parents, help your students learn and know traffic rules while riding a bicycle.
- Helmets and locks for the bike rack are strongly encouraged.
